ABOUT THE COURSE

Developing a positive safety culture in the organization is a continuous process built over the time involving all employees. In fact, it is both individual and collective responsibility and requires a positive attitude inculcated through motivation, appreciation, acknowledgement, awards, recognition etc. Although the organisations appoint qualified site safety officers, in a strong safety culture, everyone feels responsible for safety and pursues it on a regular basis. Employees go beyond the call of duty to identify unsafe conditions, behaviors and intervene to correct them. Organizations have come up with a new concept of "Safety Champions" who play vital role and supplement the efforts of management for implementing the performance-based safety programs. Enthusiast safety champions act as role models for safety, identify safety hazards, correct the at-risk behaviours of others, and always look for opportunities to improve the Safety culture. Every employee may become a Safety Champion by implementing the Safety rules by themselves and encouraging others to do the same.

NSC has specially introduced this course to help the organisations to create a pool of Safety champions, who can become the pillars of a successful safety program of the organisation.

LEARNING OUTCOME

On completion of this program, the participant will be able to

identify the safety hazards & non compliances at workplace, recommend the corrective actions and also understand the requirements for enhancing the Safety culture at the workplace.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Management practices like Engineering Revision, Instructions, Personal Adjustment and Discipline, etc. have resulted in improving Safety Standards and reducing unsafe situations and accidents. Now there is a need to find and apply newer methods to reach the target of zero accident. Keeping in view of the need, in the recent past safety professionals have developed a new approach known as "Behaviour Based-Safety". This approach is based on successive years of research which showed that about 80% of accidents at the workplace are caused by unsafe behaviours.

It promotes pro-active & practical approach to genuinely help people to follow safe work practice on the job. In this approach Behaviour is considered as a base for improving safety performance because it is observable, definable & measurable also. Behaviours on the job are indicators of probable injuries and safety performance. The BBSM approach is different from traditional system approach and process approach, and focuses on one of the main aspects of safety problem i.e. At-Risk behaviour of people, which is a major cause of majority of accidents or injuries. The BBSM technique will serve as a tool to correct unsafe behaviour of people and achieve desired safe standard.

LEARNING OUTCOME

This program will enable participants to:

- Understand the concept and principles of BBSM to improve their safety performance
- Develop safety attitude
- Motivate employees to adopt safe practices at workplace

ABOUT THE COURSE

Safety and Health audit is a management tool for systematic evaluation of how well the operation and maintenance procedures match with design intent and statutes. There are already large tome of Health and Safety legislation continues to grow with the introduction of additional regulations and guidelines. Moreover, Governments also use a larger stick to punish non-compliance. Not only bigger fines are imposed on companies but their directors and senior management face imprisonment for neglect of duties.

Also, the adverse public relations resulting from poor regulatory compliance can result in lost consumer goodwill, and it can have a negative impact on valuable brand names. Statutory Compliance Audits can be used as a useful tool in reviewing an organisation's health and safety procedures and legal compliance. Findings from the compliance audit identify gaps in an organisation's current policy and procedure to enhance its safety performance. NSC has designed this 3-day training course as a regulatory audit provides an objective review of facility operations and company practices and provides a recommended process to ensure that compliance continues.

LEARNING OUTCOME

After completion of this course the participants will be get acquired with knowledge of SHE legal requirement, management system requirement, chemical, mechanical, fire, occupational health, industrial hygiene and electrical hazards.

This course enables participants to -

- Identify SHE related statutory compliance requirement

- Identify significant hazards and risks in their work areas.
- Carry out internal audit for SHE legal compliance.
