Electrical Safety - Regulations and Standards

ABOUT THE COURSE

Today electricity has become the backbone of development. It is one of the essentials required to sustain modern society life. Electricity, though a good servant, may prove to be hazardous if due care is not exercised in its use. Accident statistics show that nearly 40% of electrical accidents have resulted into fatality indicating its potential of severity. Although utmost safety is observed while manufacturing of electrical equipment, any error in installation, improper maintenance and ignorance of the safety precautions during their use may lead to an accident.

The Electricity Act, 2003, and the Central Electricity Authority (Measures relating to Safety and Electric Supply) Regulations, 2023 are applicable in Generation, Distribution, Installation and Maintenance of Electricity and aim to reduce/eliminate electrical accidents.

With an increase in reported injuries and deaths associated with use of electricity, electrical safety is becoming a more prominent health and safety topic in industry. The National Safety Council is organising 2-day Training Programme on “**Electrical Safety - Regulations and Standards**” based on above mentioned act and regulations to enable participants for preventing/controlling the electrical hazards at the workplace.

ABOUT THE COURSE

An accident is not merely a single event; it is the outcome of a transformation process in which an activity or operation is unexpectedly interrupted, resulting in unintentional harm. Recognizing this, the Factories Act, 1948, State Factories Rules, and various other statutes mandate systematic accident reporting and investigation as a vital tool for identifying unsafe acts and unsafe conditions, thereby reducing health and safety risks arising from workplace hazards.

Accident and incident investigations are widely practiced across industries such as manufacturing, chemical process plants, and construction sites. However, many investigations fall short of their true purpose, often focusing on fault-finding rather than uncovering root causes, systemic deficiencies in safety management systems, and the critical preventive factors that could have averted the incident.

When conducted effectively, accident investigations become powerful drivers of positive change, leading to improvements in training systems, operating procedures, work instructions, emergency response planning, and overall safety culture. This workshop aims to equip participants with a structured and practical approach to accident reporting, investigation, and analysis by drawing upon statutory provisions and nationally and internationally recognized guidelines, including CCPS, ILO guidelines, and IS 3786:2022.

NSC will also share its extensive experience in conducting accident investigations, highlighting common challenges faced during investigations and practical solutions to overcome them, thereby enabling participants to conduct meaningful investigations that prevent recurrence and strengthen workplace safety systems.

LEARNING OUTCOME

These 2 days workshop will enlighten the participants on the key elements of incident/accident investigation, root cause analysis and developing corrective and preventive actions to eliminate similar incidents reoccurring.

ABOUT THE COURSE

The Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 (OSHWC Code) consolidates and rationalises thirteen central labour laws relating to safety, health and working conditions of workers across sectors such as factories, mines, construction, contract labour, and inter-state migrant workers. The Code introduces a uniform framework focusing on prevention, employer accountability, worker welfare, and ease of compliance.

This 2 days of training programme is designed to provide necessary clarity on major provisions of the OSHWC Code, 2020 and understanding practical implications in its implementation for ensuring effective safety management practices.

LEARNING OUTCOME

At the end of the programme, participants will be able to:

- Understand the objectives, scope, and applicability of the OSHWC Code, 2020
- Interpret key definitions, thresholds, and coverage under the OSHWC Code, 2020
- Identify duties and responsibilities of employers, occupiers, contractors, and employees
- Comprehend provisions related to registration, licensing, and compliance mechanisms
- Apply statutory requirements related to occupational safety, health, and welfare at workplaces
- Understand how to prepare for complying new provisions related to contract workers and migrant workers.

- Case studies on chemical industries, manufacturing sector, construction sector and fires

- Techniques of accident / incidents report writing
