

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2023-2024

1.0 INTRODUCTION

I am pleased to present the Annual Report of the National Safety Council (NSC) for the financial year 2023-2024, which includes the audited Income & Expenditure Statement and the Balance Sheet. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the Board of Governors, NSC members, and all our stakeholders for their unwavering support for our new initiatives and activities in diversified areas. This collective effort has been instrumental in driving the Council's sustained growth throughout the year.

2.0 52nd ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The 52nd Annual General Meeting (AGM) of NSC was held on Wednesday, the 13th December, 2023 at 1245 hrs. at Indian Merchants' Chamber, Mumbai. The meeting was chaired by Shri Arvind R. Doshi, Vice Chairman (E), NSC as Shri S.N. Subrahmanyan, Chairman, NSC had conveyed his inability to attend the meeting due to some unavoidable circumstances. In all, 76 NSC members comprising of representatives of organisations, life and individuals attended the meeting.

6.0 ACTIVITIES / COLLABORATION

6.1 Signing of MOUs/Agreements

The National Safety Council (NSC) has consistently pursued long-term collaborations with its leading corporate members and other organizations, working to meet their Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) needs through strategic partnerships. As part of these efforts, NSC has entered into several Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) / agreements to strengthen these alliances.

1. On 10th April, 2023, NSC has signed a Memorandum of Cooperation (MoC) with the Construction Industry Development Council (CIDC) during their India Construction Meet, held in New Delhi. The CIDC was established by the Niti Aayog (erstwhile Planning Commission) in association with the Construction Industry, is an apex body to take up and promote activities for the development of the Indian Construction Industry. The MoC, was signed by Dr. Lalit R. Gabhane, Director General of NSC, and Dr. P.R. Swarup, Director General of CIDC. The agreement will remain in effect for three years. This collaboration aims to jointly promote safety awareness and advocate for improved safety, health, and environmental standards within the Indian construction sector.

- 2. On 4th July, 2023, NSC signed its first-ever 1-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Petroleum and Explosives Safety Organization (PESO). The MoU was signed by Shri R.R. Deoghare, Director, on behalf of DG, NSC, and Shri H.K. Sharma, Deputy Chief Controller of Explosives, on behalf of the Chief Controller of Explosives, PESO. The MoU, which can be extended by mutual consent, outlined a framework for technical cooperation between PESO and NSC. It focuses on developing, designing, and delivering Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) training programmes for organizations under PESO's purview as well as NSC members.
- 3. To further strengthen its long-standing relationship with the Steel Authority of India (SAIL), NSC has signed a 1-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the 13th consecutive year on 3rd November, 2023. The MoU was signed by DG, NSC and Shri Asish Chakraborty, Executive Director of SAIL's Safety Organization, on behalf of SAIL. The agreement, which can be extended by mutual consent, aims to uphold the highest standards in Occupational Safety, Health, and Environment (OSHE) through ongoing technical cooperation and knowledge exchange between the two organizations. Several initiatives, including safety audits, training programmes, and OSH consultancy services, are planned across various SAIL locations as part of this collaboration.
- 4. To establish a collaboration with the Land Port Authority of India (LPAI), NSC has signed a 3-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with LPAI for the first time on 31st January, 2024. LPAI is a statutory body under the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India, constituted under the Land Ports Authority of India Act, 2010. This Act empowers the Authority

- to develop, manage, and operate land ports, and to regulate the movement of goods and passengers across India's international land borders. The MoU was signed by DG, NSC, and Shri Aditya Mishra (IPS), Chairman of LPAI, at the LPAI Office in New Delhi. The validity of the MoU can be extended by mutual consent. The MoU aims to strengthen the OSH Standards at the land ports across India.
- 5. In an effort to establish a new collaboration, NSC has signed a one-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Indian Association of Amusement Parks and Industries (IAAPI) for the first time on 28th February 2024. The MoU was signed by DG, NSC, and by Shri Shrikant Goenka, Chairman, and

Shri Pradeep Sharma, Chairman of the Safety Committee, on behalf of IAAPI during their Business Excellence Award ceremony. The agreement, which can be extended by mutual consent, aims to benefit the amusement park industry by raising safety awareness and providing guidance to employees and endusers of amusement rides & equipment. This includes promoting the optimal use of safety appliances, services, technologies, and equipment across the industry.

6.2 DG-NSC chaired CHD-07 and CHD-08 Committee meetings of BIS

As the National Standards Body of India, the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) plays a pivotal role in developing Indian Standards across various industrial sectors, covering products, testing methods, and services. The two key BIS committees, CHD-07 and CHD-08, are chaired by DG, NSC.

CHD-07: Chemical Hazards Sectional Committee The CHD-07 Committee is tasked with drafting and formulating standards and codes of practice related to chemical hazards.

- The 11th Meeting (29th August, 2023): Held virtually and chaired by Dr. Gabhane.
 This meeting was attended by 26 members. Discussions revolved around process reforms in BIS's standardization activities and initiatives to identify new areas for standardization. Shri A.Y. Sundkar, Director (Principal Member), and Shri K.D. Patil, Deputy Director (Alternate Member) attended the meeting.
- The 12th Meeting (8th November, 2023): Conducted on a hybrid mode with 25 members in attendance. The meeting focused on further process reforms and finalized the Terms of Reference (ToR) for an R&D project.

NSC's leadership continues to guide the committee's efforts to advance standards in chemical hazards.

CHD-08: Occupational Safety and Health Sectional Committee The CHD-08 Committee is responsible for drafting and formulating standards and codes of practice in the field of occupational safety and health.

- The 23rd Meeting (28th April, 2023): Held on hybrid mode and chaired by Dr. Gabhane. This meeting had the participation of 38 members. The committee reviewed and revised various Indian Standards based on feedback from members. Shri Sundkar, Director NSC attended the meeting as a member.
- The 24th Meeting (31st October, 2023): Chaired by Dr. Gabhane, this hybrid meeting involved 25 members. Discussions centered around reviewing and revising standards based on comments received, continuing the committee's work to enhance occupational safety standards. Shri Sundkar attended the meeting.
- The 25th Meeting (21st March, 2024): In this hybrid meeting, chaired by Dr. Gabhane, the committee continued its review of Indian Standards and revisions based on members feedback. Both Shri Sundkar and Shri Patil attended the meeting, reflecting NSC's commitment to improving safety and health standards.

Through Dr. Gabhane's leadership, the CHD-07 and CHD-08 committees are making significant contributions to safety, health, and environmental standards in India.

6.3 Visit of students of Lokmanya Medical Research Centre, Pune to the NSC office

On 17th May, 2023, a group of 25 students from Lokmanya Medical Research Centre (LMRC), Pune, visited NSC Headquarters. A special program was organized for the students. The session concluded with an interactive question-and-answer segment, allowing the students to interact with NSC representatives. They were also given a guided tour of the various facilities at NSC.

6.4 Asia Pacific Occupational Safety and Health Organization (APOSHO)

6.4.1 NSC's Participation in APOSHO-37 Committee Meetings, Conference and AGM

NSC Board of Governors approved a two-member delegation from NSC India to participate in the APOSHO-37 Committee Meetings, Conference, and Annual General Meeting (AGM), hosted by the Malaysian Society for Occupational Safety and Health (MSOSH) in Shah Alam, Malaysia from 23rd to 26th October 2023. The event was attended by Shri Mukesh Galav, Vice Chairman (W), and Dr. Gabhane, DG, NSC. The theme of the APOSHO-37 Conference was "Moving Forward Beyond Compliance," emphasizing the future of occupational safety and health practices.

6.4.2 NSC hosting APOSHO-39 Conference in 2025 in India

NSC will be hosting APOSHO-39 Conference from 26th to 29th November, 2025 at New Delhi at India International Convention and Expo Center, Yashobhoomi, Dwarka, New Delhi. The program comprises of APOSHO Committee Meetings, Conference and AGM.

6.5 23rd World Congress on Safety & Health at Work

The World Congress on Safety and Health at Work is a global forum for advancing workers health protection. It is the largest event for the international occupational health and safety community and provides a platform for sharing experiences and information with the aim of prevention worldwide.

The 23rd World Congress on Safety and Health at Work was jointly organized by International Labour Organization (ILO); the International Social Security Association (ISSA) and SafeWork New South Wales (NSW) Government, Australia in Sydney from 27th-28th November, 2023. The host, SafeWork NSW is the government regulator for work health and safety in the state of New South Wales, Australia. The Congress brought together more than 3000 delegates from 127 countries. Dr. Lalit Gabhane, DG, NSC and Shri Sundkar, Director, NSC attended the Congress.

The theme of Congress was "Shaping change - collaborating for a healthier and safer world of work". The Congress was focused on working together for a better future, a changing world of work, as well as how to future-proof against on-going and re-emerging risks.

6.6 Seminar / Conference / Conclave

6.6.1 The Council, on the invitation of the Fire & Security Association of India (FSAI), has organized a 1-day seminar "Emerging Trends in Safety, Health & Environment" on 26th August 2023 in the Fire and Security India Expo (FSIE) held on 24th-26th August, 2023 at Jio World Convention Centre, Mumbai. FSIE has been co-organised by FSAI and Nova Exhibitions & Conferences. In FSIE, on each day there were different thematic seminars along with the Expo.

In NSC seminar, the following three technical sessions were organized, in which 13 speakers contributed to the deliberations. These sessions were chaired by the eminent personalities viz. S/Dr. Lalit Gabhane, DG, NSC; S.K. Bajpai, Executive Director, HSE, IOCL Marketing Division and Ashok Menon,

Former Director, Fire & Emergency Services, Goarespectively.

- New OSH Tools & Techniques
- Use of Advance Technology in OSH
- New Trends Challenges and Opportunities in OSH

The Council also participated in the Expo and showcased its services and publications including safety posters, films, etc. in the stall. The visitors interacted with the officers of NSC at the stall and expressed their interest in the services and publications.

- **6.6.2** To increase awareness about the dangers, hazards, precautions / preventive measures to be taken by workers of agriculture sector, a 1-day Seminar on "Safety in Agriculture Sector" was conducted by NSC for the first time on 10th February, 2024 for farmers in and around Kota, Rajasthan. It was inaugurated by Shri Mukesh Galav, Vice Chairman (W), NSC and the session was conducted by Shri Deoghare, Director, NSC and Shri A.S. Karmarkar, Member, Expert Panel of NSC. This seminar was held at Training Hall of West Central Railway Employees Union Office, Kota Division. More than 40 participants attended the Seminar.
- 6.6.3 A 1-day National Conclave on Safety, Health & Environment (SHE) was organized by NSC on 15th March, 2024 at Hyderabad Marriott Hotel & Convention Centre, Telangana. The theme of the Conclave was "ESG Excellence through Safety Leadership". In the opening ceremony of the Conclave, Smt. I. Rani Kumudini, IAS, Special Chief Secretary–Labour, Employment Training and Factories Department, Govt. of Telangana was the Chief Guest and delivered a speech. Shri B. Raja Gopala Rao, Director of Factories, Govt. of Telangana attended as a Guest of Honour and delivered an opening remark. There were over 470 participants including invitees, session's chairmen, speakers, delegates, and exhibitors. Total 17 speakers including an international speaker contributed to the deliberations of the Conclave in the four technical sessions. These sessions were chaired by the eminent personalities.

6.6.4 To increase awareness about health and safety at workplace among the contractor workers, NSC conducted a 1-day Seminar on "Health and Safety of Contractor Workers" at the Auditorium of Durgapur Steel Plant (DSP), Durgapur, West Bengal on 20th March, 2024. About 100 participants from DSP and other organizations attended the seminar. During the seminar, topics like Safety at Workplace, Fire Safety, Housekeeping and PPE were discussed. This seminar was inaugurated by Shri Sanjay Srivastava, CGM (Safety), DSP. Shri Deoghare, Director, NSC conducted the seminar.

7.0 TECHNICAL SERVICES

7.1 Safety Audits/Consultancy Services

NSC has consolidated and strengthened its leadership position in the field of OSH by conducting consultancy assignments of manufacturing, construction and service sectors. These includes Safety Audits, Review Safety Audits, Safety Audit as per Maharashtra Factories, Rules-2014 & 2017, Environment Safety Audit, Occupational Health & Safety Management System Audit as per IS 14489: 2018, Preparation of Safety Report, Pre-Commissioning / Start-up / Pre-Occupation Safety Audit, HAZOP Studies, Quantitative Risk Assessment, HIRA, Preparation of Safety Manual and Preparation/Review of On-Site Emergency Plan / Emergency Evacuation Plan, etc. There has been great demand for all these types of assignments.

As a major player in safety auditing, NSC has been responding to all the requests from organisations. If an assignment demands, multi-disciplinary teams are constituted under the leadership of technical officers for simultaneous fieldwork in different locations. The recommendations provided by NSC in the Safety Audit report are the source of improvement in eradicating the existing hazards and putting forth a healthy atmosphere. During the year 2023-24, in all 185 consultancy assignments were carried out.

7.2 National Safety Aptitude Test

The National Safety Aptitude Test (NSAT) is an online examination conducted by NSC from the year 2022. The objectives of NSAT are to assess candidates'

comprehensive understanding of safety science, safety laws, risk management, safety engineering/management, leadership abilities, and general aptitude. The NSAT score, valid for two years, reflects the candidate's performance in the occupational safety, health & environment field.

The NSAT-2023 examination was conducted on 2^{nd} September, 2023 for which 402 candidates registered. In all 350 candidates attended the examination out of which 338 candidates passed the exam. On the demand from organisations, NSAT-2023 was extended to construction and oil & gas sector organisations and 35 and 204 candidates respectively appeared for it.

7.3 NSCI Safety Rating System (NSRS)

NSC has upgraded and relaunched the Safety Rating System with Certification in 2022 with the title "Excellence in Safety – 5 Golden Stars" for all industrial and commercial establishments to assess their Safety, Health, and Environmental (SHE) performance. This system enables organizations to benchmark their SHE practices using a standardized evaluation method across India. The primary objective of the safety rating system is to encourage continuous improvement in SHE standards.

The NSC Safety Rating System (NSRS) is a comprehensive evaluation that covers 8 key elements and approximately 88 sub-elements, all focused on driving excellence in safety management.

In the financial year 2023-24, ten organizations/sites participated in the NSRS, with five organizations achieving the prestigious 5- Golden Star Rating for their outstanding SHE performance.

7.4 NSCI Safety Shield

NSC has introduced the prestigious NSCI Safety Shield in 2023 to recognize or g a n i z a t i o n s demonstrating exceptional c o m m i t m e n t t o Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) practices. This advanced assessment goes beyond the NSCI's 5 Golden Star Rating System, rewarding organisations that have achieved the highest level of safety excellence.

During the F.Y. 2023-24, five organisations received the coveted NSCI Safety Shield. These exemplary companies were presented with the Shield during the NSCI Safety Awards 2023 ceremony by Smt. I. Rani Kumudini, IAS, Special Chief Secretary, Labour Employment Training and Factories Department, Govt. of Telangana.

7.5 Training Programmes

7.5.1 Training Programmes/courses and Need-based Inplant Training Programmes

NSC offers a wide range of training programmes, including public training programmes held at various locations across the country, need-based inplant training programmes, and virtual training programmes. These programme sessions are designed to be highly engaging, featuring interactive discussions, safety videos, practical exercises, and real-world case studies.

During the year, 42 national and virtual training programmes were conducted, with approximately 1,054 participants trained. Detailed information can be found in **Annex-VI** (Page 40). Additionally, 138 inplant training programmes were conducted on diverse topics and trained around 3,475 participants in different industries. In total, 4,529 individuals benefited from these training programmes.

7.5.2 E-learning Training Courses

NSC offers the following seven specialized e-learning courses designed to enhance the knowledge of the participants on safety, health and environmental management practices across industries. During the reporting period, in all 276 participants attended these courses.

- 1. Safety at Construction Sites
- 2. Chemical Safety
- 3. Industrial Safety
- 4. Electrical Safety
- 5. Office Safety
- 6. Advanced Industrial Safety
- 7. Environmental Management System

8.0 SAFETY PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES

8.1 53^{rd} National Safety Day / Week Campaign (4^{th} – 10^{th} March, 2024)

The National Safety Day / Week (NSD/W) Campaign spearheaded by the Council to commemorate its Foundation Day on 4th March has celebrated 53rd year of the campaign for the year 2024. The Campaign has now grown into a major national event in the OSH field and is widely celebrated by the industry, trade unions, Govt. departments, regulatory agencies, NGOs and institutions, etc. throughout the

country. The theme for this year's Campaign was "Focus on Safety Leadership for ESG Excellence".

As in the previous years, the NSD Campaign-2024 received full support from the Ministry of Labour & Employment, Govt. of India. The Ministry had written letters to State Labour Ministers / Labour Governors / Administrations of all States / UTs and requested them to advise the concerned authorities in their state to ensure that the National Safety Day is organized in a befitting manner. The Ministry has also sent letters to the DG, Doordarshan and DG, All India Radio requesting to give adequeate coverage to various events / activities which was organized in different parts of the country.

An appeal was issued to all members and patrons vide Council's letter dated 28th November 2023 to organize the 53rd NSD / Week Campaign from 4th March 2024 on a grand scale. The Campaign is aimed at renewing the commitment of employees and general public to work safely throughout the year. To assist them in organizing the Campaign effectively, the Council, as in the past had developed and brought out a variety of promotional literatures and utility articles carrying safety messages and slogans aimed at ensuring integration of OSH in work culture and lifestyle. During the week, all the members of NSC in their broader aspects extended their actions to families, townships, schools/colleges and community to adopt the good practices of road safety, home safety and emergency preparedness for their betterment.

The information about NSD/W was provided to the viewers and also the queries received from the common masses were answered.

Also, Shri Deoghare, Director, NSC participated (through telephone) in the Radio Programmes i.e. Red FM 93.5, Apna Radio 96.9 and Radio Tarang 90.0 FM and answered their questions. Further, NSC officers were invited by NSC's Member

organizations for delivering addresses at the functions organized by them on the occasion.

8.2 Fire Service Week (14th - 20th April, 2023)

NSC has been actively promoting the Fire Service Week (FSW), which is held annually from 14th to 20th April under the guidance of the Fire Advisor, Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India. The theme for FSW 2023, as decided by the Ministry, was "Awareness in Fire Safety for Growth of National Infrastructure (AGNI)."

To support members and patrons in effectively observing FSW, NSC developed and distributed a variety of promotional materials featuring key safety messages, including safety posters, photoluminescent signages, etc. These materials were supplied to 150 companies nationwide.

8.3 Celebration of the World Environment Day (5th June, 2023)

The World Environment Day (WED) is being spearheaded by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) since 1972. NSC has been promoting the observance of the WED since 1999. The theme for WED 2023 was "Beat Plastic Pollution".

The organizations actively participated in the WED Campaign and celebrated it in their premises. For effective promotion and observance of the WED-2023 Campaign, NSC developed various promotional materials and made available to the organizations and other patrons on demand.

NSC officials participated in WED celebration of D.Y. Patil's Dnyaypushpa Vidya Niketan School, CBD Belapur, Navi Mumbai. NSC officers addressed the students and briefed about the theme of WED-2023 and importance of the environment.

8.4 Promotion of National Electrical Safety Week Campaign (26th June, 2023 – 2nd July, 2023)

In addition to the other campaigns, NSC has been actively promoting "National Electrical Safety Week" (NESW) Campaign since 2020, with the active support of Central Electricity Authority, Govt. of India.

The objective of the NESW is to raise the awareness and enthusiasm among the public and industries on Electrical Safety and to renew the commitment of the employee and public towards safe use of Electricity. The theme for NESW-2023 was "Electrical Safety – Don't Compromise, Be Wise". NSC bought out various promotional materials with topical messages on electrical safety.

8.5 Road Safety Month Campaign (15th January, 2024–14th February, 2024)

The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways observes National Road Safety Month every year. Hon'ble Minister had directed to observe National Road Safety Month from 15th January, 2024 to 14th February, 2024 with the theme **'Sadak Suraksha – Jeevan Raksha'**. To contribute to the cause, NSC had started promoting the Road Safety Campaign from the year 2011. To assist members and patrons in effectively

promoting and organizing the Campaign, the Council developed various promotional materials such as safety badge, safety banners, safety posters, films, key-chain, cap, reflective jacket, etc. with road safety messages. There was good demand for the promotional material. Members enthusiastically participated in the Campaign.

9.0 NSCISAFETY AWARDS

As part of its services, the Council instituted and has been operating four distinct NSCI Safety Award Schemes for Manufacturing (1998), Construction (2005), Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (2009), and Service (2020) sectors. Subsequently, the manufacturing, construction, and MSME sectors have been classified into different groups as provided below:

9.1 NSCI Safety Awards-2023

During FY 2023-24, a total of 676 applications were received. The sector wise status of applications are as follows:

Assessment of Applications and finalization of the awards

As a stage-1 assessment, the applications were assessed by the field experts according to the established assessment criteria. The assessment's score was placed before the NSCI Safety Awards Committee. The list of Committee Members is furnished as **Annex - IX** (Page 47).

The NSCI Safety Awards Committee met three times on the virtual platform. The first meeting was held on 14th-15th December 2023, in which top ranked establishments at stage-1 assessment from construction sector were invited for presentation. The second meeting was held on 21st-22nd December 2023, in which the top ranked organization at stage-1 assessment from manufacturing and service sectors were invited for presentation.

Based on the assessment of the applications, field visits and presentations, sectorwise final merit lists were prepared and presented to the committee in its third meeting held on 1st January 2024. The committee deliberated on the merit lists and finalized the winners of the NSCI Safety Awards-2023.

To encourage and recognize organizations for their consistent excellence in safety, health, and environment, NSC introduced a Platinum Award in the manufacturing sector in 2021. The qualifying criteria for the Platinum Award are that the organization must have won at least 2 Gold NSCI Safety Awards in the past five years and achieved a score of 95% or above in the current awards year. The Committee noted that Indian Farmers Fertilizers Cooperative (IFFCO) Ltd., Kalol Unit, Gandhinagar, Gujarat, met the criteria for the Platinum Award during the year. Accordingly, the Committee, in its meeting held on 1 January 2024, bestowed the Platinum Award upon IFFCO Ltd., marking the introduction of this award.

A total 54-organisations from manufacturing sector; 23-establishments from construction sector; 11-enterprises from MSME sector and 12-establishments from service sector were declared as the winners.

The results were posted on NSC website on 1st January 2024 and subsequently letters sent to all award-winning organizations.

Awards Presentation Ceremony

The Platinum, Golden, Silver, Bronze and Prashansa Patra level awards were presented at Hyderabad Marriott Hotel & Convention Centre, Hyderabad, Telangana on the 15^{th} of March, 2024 evening at the backdrop of the National Conclave on Safety, Health & Environment, which was held on the same day.

The Awards were presented at the hand of Smt. I. Rani Kumudini, IAS, Special Chief Secretary, Labour Employment Training and Factories Department, Govt. of Telangana; Shri B. Rajagopala Rao, Director of Factories, Govt. of Telangana; Shri Arvind R. Doshi, Vice-Chairman (Employers), NSC and Dr. Lalit Gabhane, DG, NSC

Total 99 organisations were received the awards in different levels – Platinum award with certificate, Sarva Shreshtha Suraksha Puraskar – Golden Trophy with Certificate, Shreshtha Suraksha Puraskar – Silver Trophy with Certificate, Suraksha Puraskar – Bronze Trophy with Certificate and Prashansa Patra. Along with the winners, 22 client organizations from Construction Sector were also been awarded. The winner's lists are provided at **Annexure X** (Page 48).

The function was well attended by over 470 persons from the Award winning organisations invitees and conclave delegates across the country.

9.2 NSCI Safety Awards – 2024

During the report period, Awards scheme for the year 2024 for manufacturing, construction, MSME and service sectors has been announced on NSC website in January, 2024.

10.0 PUBLICATIONS & PROMOTIONAL MATERIAL

10.1 National Safety Calendar – 2024

Since the year 1979, NSC brings out it's wall calendar depicting safety messages through attractive cartoons/pictures. The aim is to convey the safety messages to the masses everyday throughout the year, in an effective and striking manner.

The Calendar for 2024 was designed by Shri Prabhakar Wairkar, a well-known cartoonist in the advertising world, honoured with National & International Awards. The Calendar depicted important topics related to occupational safety, health, environment and hygiene through cartoons including the information sheet on "Scaffolding Safety". In all, 1,34,765 copies of the NSCI wall Calendar and 14643 no. of desk calendars were printed and distributed.



A copy of the Wall Calendar was provided to all NSC members as free membership service.

10.2 HSE Diary-2024

Health, Safety & Environment (HSE) Diary is being published by the Council since 1998 with an objective to disseminate the useful information on HSE for day-to-day usage and reference. The information provided in the Diary-2024 was on diverse topics. The Diary-2024 had 244 pages of which about 60 pages containing information on HSE.

The orders received for 34,462 copies from organizations including industries, institutions, regulatory agencies, professionals, etc. were executed. Total 35,000 copies (including complimentary) were printed and distributed to the members and patrons.

10.3 Safety Posters/Pocket Guides

NSC maintains a stock of Safety Posters, Pocket Guides, etc. in English and Hindi languages. Every year new posters and pocket guides on the relevant topics are printed and added to the stock. During the year, a Poster "Our AIM – ZERO HARM" was added to the stock, which was brought during NSD – 2023 campaign.

During the year, 73,000 copies of posters were printed. Total 26,112 posters and pocket guides were circulated and sold. NSC supplied 12 types of safety posters as part of the membership service to all its Corporate Members free of cost. Further, during the year, 31 copies of DVDs, 285 books and 2,782 signages were sold on the topics of Safety, Health and Environment.

10.4 Industrial Safety Chronicle

The quarterly journal Industrial Safety Chronicle continues to be regularly published in English language. During the reporting period, four issues were released and distributed to all members as part of their complimentary membership benefits. Soft copies of the journal were also uploaded on the NSC Connect Portal. Additionally, copies were sent to subscribers, NSC Board Members, key institutions and Govt. depts. including the Union Ministries of Labour & Employment, Environment, Forests and Climate Change;



DGFASLI, Regional Labour Institutes, Chief Inspectorates of Factories, Pollution Control Boards, and other government bodies related to Occupational Safety and Health (OSH), on a reciprocal or complimentary basis.

10.5 Industrial Safety News

During the year, six issues of the bi-monthly Industrial Safety News were published as e-newsletters. Soft copies were emailed to all members as part of their complimentary membership service. Also, the newsletters made available for free download on NSC website and the NSC Connect Portal.

These newsletters keep members informed about NSC's latest activities, newly developed services, special assignments, and key updates on safety. Additionally, they provide valuable insights into legislative amendments related to safety, health, and environment.

10.6 Library

NSC maintains a well-equipped library of books and periodicals, accessible to its members, students, and employees. The collection includes approximately 3,300 technical resources such as books, manuals, reports, handbooks, codes, standards, and conference proceedings focusing on safety, health, environment, and related fields. New titles are added to the library each year to enhance the collection. This year, OISD standards in e-format were acquired for the library.

NSC also receives periodicals from renowned international and national organizations, including the National Safety Council (USA), International Social Security Association (ISSA), APOSHO Members, Bureau of Indian Standards, Indian Chemical Council, Builders Association of India, Automobile Research Association of India, Automation & Security India, CIRT's Indian Journal of Transport Management, and Indian Construction Journal for the Indian architecture, building, and construction industries.

11.0 AUDITED STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS FOR THE F.Y. 2023-24

12.0 NSC CHAPTERS

As per the Subvention Rules, subvention was paid to the eligible Chapters of NSC for the F.Y. 2023-24.

12.2 Chapter Activities

NSC has a wide network of 12 Chapters to cater to the needs of its members particularly at the local level. A resume of the Activities carried out by the Chapters during the year under report is furnished at **Annex-XII** (Page 68).

Based on the feed-back received from the members/patrons and after due assessment of their needs, NSC is constantly striving hard to develop and introduce newer activities in its mission of promoting Safety, Health & Environment at the national level. MINUTES OF THE 52nd ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF NATIONAL SAFETY COUNCIL

(Held at 1245 hrs. on Wednesday, the 13th Dec., 2023 at IMC, Mumbai)

- 1. The 52nd Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the National Safety Council was held at 1245 hrs. on Wednesday, the 13th Dec., 2023 at Indian Merchants' Chamber, Mumbai as notified through the Notice-cum-Agenda letter No. NSC/ADMN/517/AGM-52/2023 dated 1st Nov., 2023.
- 2. Shri Lalit R. Gabhane, DG, NSC welcomed all the Members. DG informed the members that the office of the Chairman, NSC, Shri S.N. Subrahmanyan has conveyed through email that due to some unavoidable circumstances, Shri Subrahmanyan will not be able to attend the Board Meeting. Therefore, Shri Subrahmanyan, has advised Shri Arvind R. Doshi, Vice Chairman (E), NSC to chair the Annual General Meeting of the Council. Accordingly, the meeting was chaired by Shri Doshi. Along with Shri Doshi, Shri Mukesh Galav, Vice Chairman (Workers) and Shri Lalit R. Gabhane, DG, NSC were on the dais. In the near future, members will be informed of the other details about the venue, dates, theme, etc. I urge all members to promote and participate in the Conference in large numbers, as it is being held almost after 9 years.

4. ADDRESS BY THE VICE CHAIRMAN (E)

Shri Arvind Doshi, Vice Chairman (E), NSC extended a warm welcome and thanked members for joining 52nd AGM of the Council. His AGM speech is reproduced below:

"Good afternoon and a heartfelt welcome to each one of you at the 52nd Annual General Meeting of National Safety Council. On behalf of the NSC Board of Governors, I extend my sincere gratitude for your unwavering trust, encouragement, and steadfast support to the Council.

Dear members, over the past 57 years, the NSC has played a pivotal role in supporting its member organizations by providing diverse services in the realms of occupational health, safety, and the environment. The year 2022-23 witnessed the NSC's outstanding performance, demonstrating its commitment to service excellence and collaboration with industries for safety and health.

The Annual Report, along with the Audited Statement of Accounts for the Financial Year ending on March 31, 2023, is now available on the NSC website. Allow me to present a concise overview of the Council's achievements during the financial year 2022-23.

- 1. The NSC sustained its growth momentum in the Financial Year 2022-23, achieving a remarkable 34% increase in income from various activities compared to the previous year. This commendable feat, amidst a challenging business environment, underscores the growing popularity of NSC services and the trust industries place in the Council. Details of the Audited Income & Expenditure Statement and the Balance Sheet for F.Y. 2022-23 are provided in the Annual Report.
- 2. NSC has broad-based membership categories like corporate, trade-union, life & individual and student and every year new members are being enrolled to expand its network across India. I am happy to inform you that, the overall membership as of 31st March 2023 was 9781 as against 9046 of 31st March 2022.
- 3. To enhance NSC's outreach and to provide services across the country, NSC has set up state chapters. In the Financial Year 2022-23, NSC had a network of 12 Chapters in different States to cater to the needs of its members at local level and in local languages. As per NSC Board's directive, these Chapters are registered under the Societies Registration Act in their respective states.
- 4. As per the objectives stated in the Memorandum of Association, NSC has set goals by deeply analyzing its services and activities and trying to improve and enhance them. To meet the goals, NSC networks with various organizations. I am happy to share highlights of a few activities and services undertaken during the FY 2022-23.
 - NSC has been consistent in its approach to have long term collaborations with leading national & international organisations and entering into agreement with them & supporting to fulfil mutual OHS needs. As a part of these efforts, during the

year NSC has signed and renewed MoUs with:

- i) DGUV, Germany
- ii) Korea Occupational Safety, Health and Environment
- iii) Malaysia Occupational Safety and Health Practitioners Association
- iv) SAIL Safety Organisation
- v) Safety Appliances Manufacturers Association
- NSC had upgraded and relaunched its NSCI Safety Rating System in February 2022 as "Excellence in Safety 5 Golden Stars". As a next level to 5-Golden Stars, NSC developed and launched NSCI Safety Shield scheme during the year to recognize and reward excellence in occupational health, safety & environmental management system. The organizations, those who have received the 5-Golden Starratings from NSC are eligible to apply for NSCI Safety Shield. This new initiative is now getting a good response from the industries.
- NSC launched its new initiative as National Safety Aptitude Test on 4th March 2022. The first NSAT-2022 online examination was conducted on 9th July 2022, wherein 462 candidates attended. The results were declared and posted on the NSC website. A total of 354 candidates cleared the examination by scoring above 50%, which is the passing score. The feedback received from the candidates was highly encouraging.
- NSC membership management services were mostly managed manually with a limited use of digital aid. To improve speed and productivity, NSC launched NSC-Connect portal on 2nd August 2022 to manage the membership services electronically. The key benefits of the portal are:
- i) Organizations/Individuals can apply online with payment for new membership.
- ii) Existing NSC members can view their profile and update it as and when required.
- iii) Membership renewal notices are generated automatically, and invoices delivered to members online. Existing members can renew their membership by paying online payment.
- iv) Members can download the membership certificate instantly.
- v) Fully paid members can access the digital copies of NSC Chronicle and newsletter, etc.
- A 1-day Seminar on Safety, Health & Environment was organized by the Council on 4th June 2022 at Hotel Sahara Star in Mumbai. The Seminar was one of the several promotional activities undertaken by NSC during 75th year of India's independence, celebrated as Azadi Ka Amrit Mahostav. The theme of the Seminar was "Aatmanirbhar Bharat SHE Challenges & Opportunities". The theme was decided in line with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan or Self-reliant India

campaign envisaged by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India. The Seminar was attended by more than 300 delegates across India.

- NSC organised its 13th National Conference on Safety, Health & Environment on 16-17th March, 2023 at Panjim, Goa. The theme of the Conference was "Challenges & Opportunities in Changing World of Work". The Conference was supported by Construction Industry Development Council, New Delhi and DGUV, Germany. The Conference was a grand success as it was attended by over 600 delegates from all over India. Total 26 experts including 3 international speakers contributed to the deliberations of the Conference. Along with the Conference, an exhibition of safety equipment was also organized.
- NSC has been pioneering in consultancy services and has established its strong footprints in the field of OSH by undertaking Consultancy Assignments comprising of various types of Safety Audits, Safety Rating, HAZOP Studies, HIRA, Mock Drill, etc. There has been a great demand for all these types of assignments.
 - As a major player in safety auditing, NSC has been responding to requests from industries. If an assignment demands, multi-disciplinary teams are constituted under the leadership of NSC technical officers for simultaneous fieldwork in different locations. The recommendations provided by NSC in the Safety Audit report are the sources of improvements in eliminating the hazards and putting forth a healthy atmosphere. During the year 2022-23, in all 203 consultancy assignments were carried involving 1392 man-days which is higher by over 22% as compared to the previous year.
- NSC provides training on a wide range of OSH topics catering to the needs of NSC members. During the year, 61 national and virtual training programmes were conducted from which 1464 participants benefited.
 - NSC also conducts need-based training programmes at the premises of organizations. During 2022-23, a total of 78 such programmes were conducted on various topics and trained 1977 participants. NSC also has e-learning training courses on different subjects available throughout the year.
 - I am happy to inform that, NABET had accredited NSC's 3-day training programme on "NSCI Internal Auditor's Course for SHE Statutory Compliance" in 2017. Further, NABET revised accreditation scheme and extended it to online, face-to-face, and blended mode programmes. Accordingly, NSC received fresh accreditation which is valid up to 24th May 2025.
- All of you are aware that, NSC is operating four distinct NSCI Safety Award Schemes annually for manufacturing, construction, MSME and service sectors. The responses received for NSCI Safety Awards-2022 were very good compared to the last year. A total number of 603 applications were received which is higher by 6% as compared to the previous year.

The winners of the NSCI Safety Awards-2022 were felicitated during NSC's 13th National Conference on Safety, Health & Environment held at Panjim, Goa on 17th March 2023.

- 5. A quality management system is a way of defining how an organization can meet the requirements of its customers and other stakeholders affected by its work. Keeping in mind its excellence and being a service-oriented organization, NSC has obtained ISO 9001:2015 certification for quality management system from the Indian Register Quality Systems in October 2022. The certification is valid up to 6th October 2025.
- 6. NSC always extends its support, involves and contributes to government efforts whenever there is a request. Accordingly, during the year DG, NSC represented NSC as one of the members on:
 - i) The committee of experts constituted by the Department of Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Explosive section of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Govt. of India. The main objective of the committee was to study and recommend technological measures for ensuring safety for the fireworks shops as prescribed under the Explosives Rules, 2008.
 - ii) High Level Committee of Experts constituted by the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Govt of India for investigating the fire incident at Vishakhapatnam Major Port, which had taken place on 30th May 2022.
 - 6.1 BIS is the National Standards Body of India engaged in developing Indian Standards in various fields of industrial activities, products, testing methodologies and services. The standards are being developed by various technical committees constituted by BIS. NSC being an apex national institution in the area of occupational health & safety, DG-NSC chairs two sectional committees of BIS namely Chemical Hazards and Occupational Safety & Health. NSC officers are also members on various committees and contributes to developing the Indian Standards.
 - 6.2 The Atomic Energy Regulatory Board, Govt. of India constituted a committee under the chairmanship of DG, NSC for reviewing their existing assessment methodology and criteria for industrial and fire safety award schemes. Accordingly, the committee met 4 times during the year and finalized the criteria and suggested necessary changes in the existing application forms.
- 7. NSC is constantly striving hard to develop and introduce newer activities in its mission of promoting Safety, Health & Environment at the national level. It is gearing up for future challenges with initiatives such as Safety Innovation Awards, a web-based safety education platform, and hosting the APOSHO-39 International Conference in 2025.

In conclusion, I extend my gratitude to all members and patrons for their ongoing cooperation and support in advancing NSC's mission of providing quality and affordable services in Occupational Safety and Health across the nation.
